
Re: Bringing CFL Football back to Ottawa!

No doubt you've heard that Roger Greenberg, Jeff Hunt, Bill Shenkman and I (dubbed the "Dream Team" by the Ottawa press) have been awarded a conditional CFL franchise to bring football back to Ottawa. The following will explain to you some of our motivations for pursuing a franchise and, hopefully, get you fired-up for the return of Canadian football!

First and foremost, we are football fans at heart who remember the glory days of the Rough Riders; teams led by Russ Jackson, Ronnie Stewart and, in later years, Tom Clements and Tony Gabriel. There was tremendous civic passion for the team, which served as an economic engine for the tourism, hospitality and retail industries. We hope to rekindle that passion for CFL football in Ottawa, the Ottawa Valley and the Outaouais.

The first major hurdle is reaching an agreement with the City of Ottawa to play in a refurbished Frank Clair Stadium at Lansdowne Park. At this point in time, as discussions commence with members of City Council, the best way for individuals and businesses to show their support for professional football in Ottawa is through the PRN (Priority Registration Number) campaign. We believe Ottawa has fans who care about CFL football, and we intend to build on that fan base to establish a successful franchise. However, the success of the team begins with identifying that fan base so, in addition to signing up for your own PRN, I encourage you to pass this message along to other football fans. PRN information and an extensive Q&A document can be found on the Ottawa 67's website (www.Ottawa67s.com). For a relatively modest deposit, you can help play an important role in bringing CFL football back to the Nation's Capital. Please take the time to visit the website in the next week or two and support our efforts to get the team up-and-running.

I graduated from the High School in 1959 along with Bob Chiarelli , Garry Guzzo etc and went on to take engineering at the University of Ottawa and an MBA from Western. I also played football at the universities of Ottawa and Western and as I attend alumni events for those teams I reflect that the junior team that I played on in 1958 at St Pats was the most talented I ever played on and perhaps the best ever.

Consider the following ;undefeated ,150 points for / only 14 against /5 shutouts
Of more significance 3 players on the team went on to be named the best amateur footballer in the city.(Vince Thompson,John Quinn and Rick Myles)

I was captain of the team with Ken Dolan and I went on to captain the Ottawa Gee Gees (MVP in 1964) and to play in Sarnia and for the Western Mustangs

My brother Vince(Doran Trophy winner)was also captain of the GeeGees and MVP in 65 and 66

The Quinn brothers Peter(now deceased) and John went on to play for Queens and Peter subsequently played for the Rough Riders and John at McMaster .

Wib Corcoran who was the star of the team went on to star for the Ottawa Sooners and also in lacrosse.

Rick Myles went on to be an all-star on the Ottawa Gee Gees

As you know you need events to bring alumni together This seems to be a good one: 50 years etc.and since we needed to be under 17 most should still be alive.

I have no idea where the grads are now other than my brother Vince and John Quinn and perhaps Bob Reid and Murray Small (professor of chemistry at University of Pennsylvania)

If you think there is merit in putting together an event in 08 I would be happy to assist While I live in Ireland (retired here 8 years ago from Toronto) we spend the summers in Canada and I visit my mother frequently in Alta Vista .
